

RESULTS OF APRIL 4, 1921 BALLOT PROPOSALS

The former school house was purchased for \$650 and negotiations began for removing from site on Benkert property to a donated lot. It was decided that the school would have to be moved in the winter when the ground was frozen. One horse, pulling a capstan device, and two men moved the building. One man was positioned in the front of the school; one man was in the back. The building rolled on the frozen ground on timbers; when the timbers rolled to the rear of the building, they were brought around again to the front. The lot donated by H.B. Allen was chosen for the site of the township hall. Mr. Allen was a prosperous lumberman and a local sawmill owner. His home and the corner of Teft and Lakefield is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Stevens.
